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Regular Homework: What could this look like?

Weekly for all subjects/year groups

- Exam Questions, recall questions, revision, doddle quiz, GCSE Pod videos and note taking/questions, exam papers, fact test, multi choice test.
- Students **self/peer assess** as a starter/review for the due date lesson
- Responsibility on students- assessed in class
- Non completion re do in detention
- Class teacher to issue and monitor

Extended Writing: 1 per learning block 7&8 Core & Ebacc

- One piece of **extended writing** per Learning Block that can count towards the M&A policy
- This must be set by the Curriculum Leader as a **common assessment** for all classes with a **common due date** towards the end of a half term/Learning block.
- Students should be given sufficient time, guidance, explicit instructions and the resources to be able to complete this independently at home
- This will help develop students extended writing skills through “BIG IDEAS”, APPLY subject knowledge and build cultural capital
- **1 per Learning Block**
- **Y9-11 ONLY where extended writing is common purposeful practice**
- **Maths excluded**

Extended Writing Task



Present New Information

It could be watching a documentary, completing independent research, reading material or revising directed content.



Make Meaning

This task should encourage students to apply and analyse the information they have gathered in lessons/research to make meaning of it. This might be in the format of teacher modelling of the task, discussion of the subject content, some in class activities to support the completion at home and clear instructions of the task.



Demonstrate Understanding

This could take the form of an extended piece of writing which should be set as a standardised common assessment with common due date. This is to be teacher assessed to count towards the M&A policy.

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Example- Extended writing

- Apply knowledge to a range of unseen scenarios
- Challenging for our disadvantaged students
- Enabling all students access educationally rich resources
- Promoting extended writing and “big ideas”
- Exposure to culture/applied learning

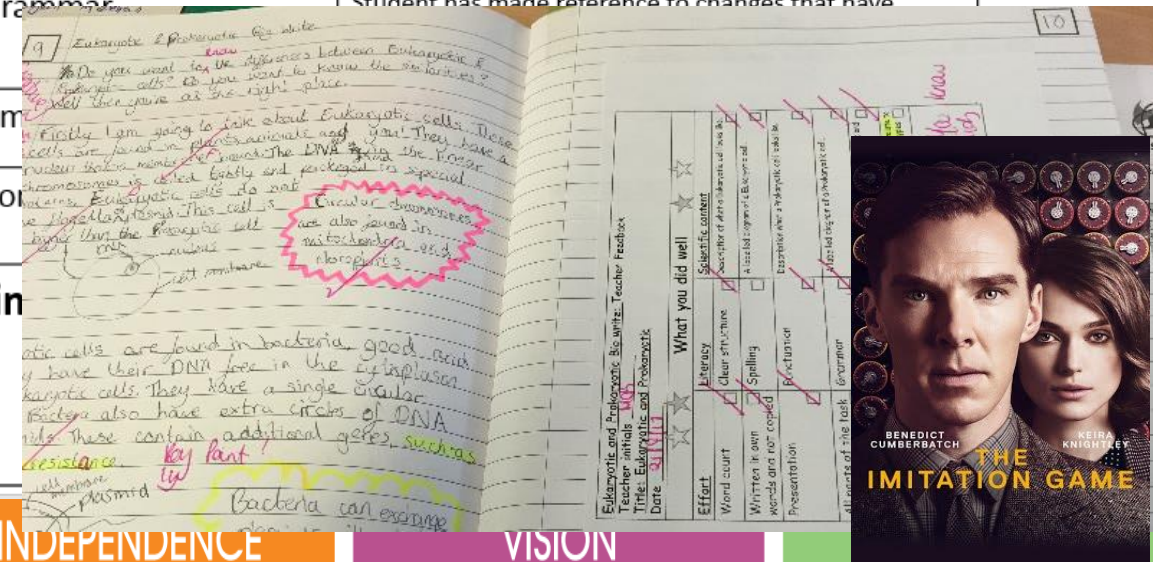

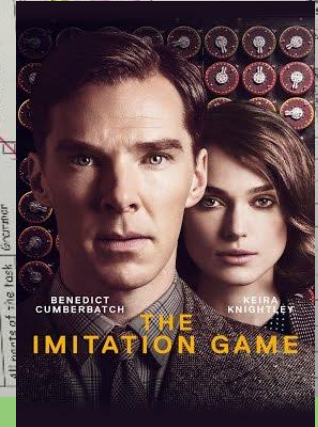

Reminder of Expectations:

- Task to be completed by due date or effort cannot be deemed good. No Homework will result in effort grade 4 and consequences.
- **Doddle quiz tasks** – remember you will be graded for your effort so repeat the quiz until you are happy with your score!
- **Extended writing tasks:** don't leave these until the last minute- they should be a substantial piece of work for you to be proud of.
- **Home study tasks-** these should use your exercise books, revision guides, revision websites alongside a range of revision techniques.
- **Progress Test reflection-** do you know where your gaps are? Do you know how to fill these gaps?

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Rewards and Consequences
